

Seed Regulatory Modernization Update

There were 412 respondents to the spring 2024 CFIA survey from across the agricultural value chain whose feedback was summarized in a "What We Heard" report found here: https://inspection.canada.ca/en/about-cfia/transparency/consultations-and-engagement/completed/seed-regulatory-modernization-winter-2024/what-we-heard-report-winter-2024

While the survey results and CSGA's vision for a next-generation seed system are strongly aligned, work to build common ground and find consensus around key issues like the **creation of an Advisory Committee** must continue. A well-defined Advisory Committee focused on offering guidance and strengthening current processes should be widely supported. This approach aligns with CSGA's original proposal, ensuring of a committee that remains advisory in nature and not a standard-setting body. CSGA believes this structure will enhance collaboration and contribute meaningfully to the success of Seed Regulatory Modernization.

SRM is an important review process for shaping the next-generation seed system. Achieving shared goals requires collaboration and open dialogue. Continue to remain informed and engaged, ask questions and reach out for clarification. CSGA's SRM webpage provides a wealth of material and a link to sign up for updates as they become available. CSGA's Special General Meeting – new membership classes

During the CSGA's recent Special General Meeting in Calgary members voted unanimously in favour of adopting new By-laws to reintroduce Affiliate and Associate memberships and update CSGA's governance.

Starting in February 2025, **Affiliate memberships** will be open to:

- Seed growers not actively producing seed crops in the current fiscal year
- Plant breeders not applying for the certification of Breeder seed in the current fiscal year
- Authorized Seed Crop Inspection Services (ASCIS), Licensed Seed Crop Inspectors (LSCI), seed analysts, seed graders, seed laboratories, seed establishments, and operators of Registered Seed Establishments authorized, licensed, accredited, or registered by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA)
- Seed companies that do not meet Regular membership requirements
- Active plant breeding institutions

Associate memberships will be open to any sector organization or association that is involved in or has an interest in pedigreed seed production to become a member, including:

- Seed sector associations
- National and provincial agriculture and agrifood associations
- Organizations that support the seed sector
- Government and intergovernmental organizations
- International seed sector associations
